

Welcome to National Museum Boerhaave

The collections of National Museum Boerhaave reflect five centuries of the history of science in the Netherlands. We are happy to acquaint visitors with the world of science on the basis of our collections. At the same time we like to maintain our valuable collections at the highest standards and make sure our visitors enjoy their stay in the museum. That is why we have introduced some house rules. We kindly request all visitors to comply with these rules. The following house rules apply in National Museum Boerhaave:

Entrance ticket

All visitors must be in possession of a valid ticket while visiting the museum.

Photography

Access

The museum is easily accessible for disabled visitors. Rollators, wheelchairs and other aids for less abled visitors are allowed in the museum. Access to the museum is limited for visitors with a mobility scooter, but there are two wheelchairs available. Assistance dogs are allowed in the museum, but no other animals. Walking sticks with a flat base and a rubber ferrule are permitted in the museum, but not Nordic walking sticks. Prams and buggies can be taken into the museum.

Cloakroom

Bags (larger than A4), rucksacks and umbrellas must be deposited in the cloakroom. There are lockers available (€ 0.50 deposit, returned after use). The use of these lockers is free, coins are also available at the front desk. The museum cannot be held responsible for items lost under any circumstance.

Phones

Please be respectful of other visitors and keep phone calls to a minimum.

Food and drink

You are very welcome to our museum café when visiting our museum. You can take food and drink into the courtyard garden, but not into the exhibition rooms.

Free WiFi

Free WiFi is available throughout the museum.

Video surveillance

There is video surveillance throughout the museum.

No smoking

Smoking is prohibited in the museum and in the courtyard garden.

Garden

Parents/carers are responsible for the safety of their children. Children's bicycles and scooters may be taken into the garden at your own risk, but may not block emergency exits. Please be advised that the museum and the garden close at 17.00.
